A wonderful example (of many!) of our strategic plan at work in strengthening our infrastructure was the purchase of a walk-in freezer and installation of an automatic sliding door in the loading area of our kitchen. We've made strides in securing our organization's long-term viability. And, we continue to deliver essential services to our senior community by promoting health, wellness, and invaluable connections.




